

The cost of fatalities and injuries

Cost components	Crash Type

Loss of life or permanent disability	4,401,000	437,200	18,800
Temporary disability	700	1,500	300

Emergency/pre-hospital	4,000	1,500	800

Legal and court	18,700	5,100	800
Vehicle damage	10,900	6,900	5,500
Total	4,445,600	467,300	26,500

Summary of main points

- New Zealand has a higher percentage of deaths in the 15-24 age group than most countries in the OECD
- New Zealand has over 8 deaths per 100,000 of population compered to 3 deaths per 100,000 in the UK for example.
- The overall number of deaths in New Zealand has reduced in the last 3 years, but mainly in the 25-44 age groups.
- The number of deaths in the 15-24 age group has not changed significantly despite changes to driving age, driving tests and reduced alcohol levels

More needs to be done to make a significant reduction in the number of fatalities amongst younger drivers especially

Why professional training is important




Why professional training is important

- Our statistics show that students who have driving lessons are more likely to pass their practical test the first time.


After a series of lessons and structured practice, students will attain the right skills to be safe drivers on our roads

Free Driving lessons - Eligibility


Since July 2013 the AA has offered Drivers who have:

Any new driver can sign-up to the offer


Its restricted to AA Members and their children because it's a benefit of membership

Learn to drive the AA way and AA Ignition
